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Background IPPAS Mission

- International Physical Protection Advisory Service:
 - Intended to help IAEA Member States (on request) to establish and maintain an effective national nuclear security regime.
 - Peer review on the implementation of international instruments: CPPNM 2005 amendment / guidances IAEA Nuclear Security Series (ex. Infcirc 225 – NSS 13)
 - Assessment includes a national level review of the legal and regulatory framework, implementation at facilities and transport
 - Basis: IPPAS Guidelines (November 2014)
 - Since 1995
 - Total of 64 missions
 - 24th of November 5th of December 2014

- Importance of nuclear security
- Regulatory framework concerning the physical protection of nuclear materials, installations and transports
- NSS Seoul 2012
- Security Conference General Conference in 2013
- Ad hoc group on Nuclear Security

Expectations

- Our expectation was that the broad experience of the IPPAS international expert team in design, implementing and regulatory oversight of nuclear security would help us to:
 - Exchange information and experiences, not only between authorities, but also with the facilities security experts
 - goal: extending our knowledge
 - Identify the good practices that can be beneficial to others
 - Demonstrate our commitment to continuous improvement
 - Promote and further develop our security culture
 - Reinforce the cooperation between all stakeholders in nuclear security

Scope of the mission

- The scope was defined in close cooperation with the IAEA
- Review of the nuclear security regime for nuclear materials and facilities (Module 1)
- Review of the facilities (Module 2)
- Transport (Module 3)
- Integration and participation of other organizations, e.g. law enforcement, crisis center, intelligence and threat assessment agencies, national security authority

Findings of the mission

Highly confidential report

<u>General</u>

- The state nuclear security regime in Belgium is robust with a programme of continuous improvements in place at both government and operator level
- In the right direction → significant progress made and further improvements planned
- Significant improvements have been made at the legal and regulatory framework and physical protection at nuclear facilities (work in progress)



Recommendations – Suggestions – Good Practices

• Good practices beneficial for other competent authorities

- License files
- Community of security experts
- DBT at 2 levels
- Process for organizing and follow-up of transports
- One good practice at operator level
- Recommendations-Suggestions
 - In the area of Armed Response
 - Importance of completing Vital Area Identification
 - Vetting aftercare
 - Contingency planning and exercises
 - Guarding
 - Recommendations and suggestions at facility level
